Alan Sillitoe Day, 27 October 2012 - a series of talks, films and discussions in the Space at Nottingham Contemporary, 11-5pm

The Alan Sillitoe Committee is a voluntary organisation committed to raising awareness of one of Nottingham's most prolific writers by putting on a series of events, the proceeds from which go towards a statue fund. Sillitoe Day is the biggest event in our calendar and falls every two years.

Our second Sillitoe Day is of particular significance as 2012 marks the 50th anniversary of The Loneliness of the Long Distance Runner. It is also the 125th anniversary of Raleigh, the workplace of Sillitoe's fictional anti-hero Arthur Seaton. The Committee will also be celebrating being one of 53 organisations commissioned to produce content for a new multimedia platform called The Space, and will launch the 'Sillitoe Trail'. This is a unique Mobile Phone App that creates a literary walk through Sillitoe's debut novel Saturday Night and Sunday Morning, visiting five key locations on its journey.

Sillitoe Day will be split into two sessions.

The morning session (11-1)

- Launch of the Sillitoe Trail Mobile App with editor James Walker and designer Paul Fillingham.
- Examining five locations from Saturday Night and Sunday Morning (Old Market Square, the White Horse, Raleigh, Trent and Goose Fair) with commissioned writers Al Needham, Derrick Buttress, Pete Davis, and Ann Featherstone
- Videos and performance from MotaMouf and Andrew 'MulletProofPoet' Graves.

Break (1 -2)

- The Bookcase, an independent bookshop from Lowdham, run by Alan's former pen pal <u>Jane Streeter</u> will be selling various books and memorabilia.
- In Spades Design produce unique mugs that focus on the cultural and emotional ties people have to local landmarks and characters.
- The Contemporary Café will be serving food.
