The Big Society Hospital - On Saturday 9th April Notts Uncut occupied Lloyds TSB on Parliament St and established the "Big Society hospital. We chose Lloyds TSB as since its £19.9bn bailout in 2008 this bank is 41% owned by the taxpayer and we don't think it's right that despite the fact Lloyds are now back in profit and paying multi million pound bonuses, they still pay no corporation tax in the UK. At the same time as Lloyds are allowed to get away with not contributing their fair share to society. Andrew Lansley is trying to pass his health and social care bill, which will effectively privatise the NHS. This will undoubtedly lead to a reduced standard of care for anyone who is unable to pay for healthcare. If we can afford to give the banks in excess of £1 trillion without expecting any payback, we can afford the NHS.
